


HEADS' LETTER

Meet our three authors: (We thank USF English Professor and SCATTER Director, Dr. Joan Kaywell, for helping us line-up this impressive team!)

- ★ **Amy Zintera aka Amy Hammond**, is the children's book author of the "When I Grow Up" Collegiate Series. Her books include *When I Grow Up, I'll Be A Gator*, *When I Grow Up, I'll Be A Bull*, and *When I Grow Up, I'll Be A 'Nole* (available at Mascot Books, campus bookstores and Barnes & Noble). She started writing these books because there was no book called *When I Grow Up, I'll Be A Gator* that she could read to her son. She got started with the book publishing process by researching publishing houses that produced books for college and professional sports teams especially since she ran track and cross country at University of Florida. She wanted her books to be authentic regarding the schools they represent.
- ★ **Greg Neri**, is the Coretta Scott King honor-winning author of *Yummy: the Last Days of a Southside Shorty* and the recipient of the Lee Bennett Hopkins Promising Poet Award for his free-verse novella, *Chess Rumble*. His books include the novels *Ghetto Cowboy*, *Knockout Games* and *Surf Mules*, and a free-verse picture book bio, *Hello, I'm Johnny Cash*. His newest is a middle grade mystery. Prior to becoming a writer, Neri was a filmmaker, an animator/illustrator, a digital media producer, and a founding member of *The Truth* anti-smoking campaign. He describes himself as being like a mash-up DJ of a writer who samples real life and re-mixes it into a story. You can find him online at www.gneri.com.
- ★ **Dr. Joan F. Kaywell**, Professor of English Education and a Florida native, received her BAE, M. Ed. and Ph.D. from the University of Florida. She has been working at the University of South Florida since 1987. She teaches undergraduate and graduate courses in English teaching methods and specializes in young adult (YA) literature. Dr. Kaywell is published in several journals; regularly reviews young adult novels for *The ALAN Review*, *The Journal of Adult and Adolescent Literacy*, and *Signal*; and has edited two series of textbooks: Four volumes of *Adolescent Literature as a Complement to the Classics*; six volumes of *Using Literature to Help Troubled Teenagers Cope with [Various] Issues*; plus she has written two textbooks: *Adolescents At Risk: A Guide to Fiction and Nonfiction for Young Adults, Parents, and Professionals* (1993) and *Adolescent Literature as a Complement to the Classics: Addressing Critical Issues in Today's Classrooms* (2010). Dr. Kaywell donates her time extensively to promoting literacy of children.

An important culminating IB-MYP experience is the community project which unites inquiry models with research, action and application of core subjects. One of the community projects is very close to the heart of Mrs. Cindy Strickland, Co-Division leader in the Middle School. Mrs. Strickland reports:

Four Eighth Grade students are in the final stages of completing their IB-MYP Community Projects. The students, Ian Alton, Ryan Haines, Trey Hodges, and Jaden Waz, have all focused their projects on the Golden Retriever Rescue of Southwest Florida (GRRSWF). The students have raised \$700 by baking dog biscuits, collecting donations, and even creating a bronze sculpture of a golden retriever to sell at auction. This generous donation has helped cover the costs associated with saving two dogs from a shelter in South Korea and their subsequent flights to Florida, where they are finding happy layovers with the Golden Retriever Rescue of Southwest Florida.

The first rescued dog, Rudi, has already made the long trip to Florida and is living happily on Marco Island with his new family. Last week, the second dog was rescued in South Korea and is anxiously awaiting her trip to Florida. As a token of gratitude for their dedication and hard work towards such a worthwhile cause, the:

Golden Retriever Rescue of Southwest Florida has asked the students to come up with the name for the newest rescue. The students came up with four names and asked their fellow classmates to help make the final decision. The votes have been counted and the rescued dog will begin her new life with the name Corbett.



After learning about the hard work and dedication of these students in their efforts to help save and rehabilitate these orphaned dogs, the liaison in South Korea wrote to the Golden Retriever Rescue of Southwest Florida saying, **“I have to think of a way we can do something like that here. They are our future, changing this world!”**
